RMS has a 6 day rotating schedule (A-F) which you may have noticed on your child's schedule.

- The rotation enables students to alternate between Social Studies and World Language/Literacy Intervention Program or another Supplemental Language Program such as Wilson Reading/Visualizing & Verbalizing.
- This also occurs in Physical Education and Encore.
- This must be an even number of days in order to maintain a balance between these two courses.
- The rotation also provide students access to the catalog of courses we offer during our Intervention and Enrichment Period (Period 1). Sample Schedule Full Day

### Intervention and Enrichment (Period 1)

#### Intervention & Enrichment

At the end of the 21-22 school year, teachers analyzed individual student plans and data to determine interventions that would target the most important areas for growth in ELA and Mathematics. We have developed curriculum and refined our placement procedures each year since.

### **Encore - What is it?**

## Encore is what we call our elective or "specials" classes here at RMS.

\*Students will switch Encore classes every Quarter (Marking Period). On your child's schedule, it will be denoted with Q1, Q2, Q3 and Q4 for each class.\*

#### **Physical Education**

- We consider Physical Education part of our Encore team although they stand alone as a full year course.
- We will integrate Health
  Education/Human Growth and
  Development into these courses
  beginning in Marking Period 2. Each
  grade will have a few units of Health
  Education in a particular Marking Period.
  (For instance, 6th Q2, 7th Q3, 8th Q4.) We will provide you with
  communication weeks prior to the start.

### Lunch/Recess (30 mins total)

#### Lunch (20 mins)

- Each grade level has their own lunch period.
- Hot lunch is provided through the <u>PTA</u>
- Lunch is provided in the Gymnasium

#### Recess (10 mins)

 After lunch, students transition into recess for the duration of the period.

#### **Indoors**

 We have the ability to offer recess indoors on half of the gym as well as other spaces throughout the building when necessary.

#### **Outdoors**

• When the weather permits, students will utilize the blacktop and back fields for recess in all seasons. Please make sure they dress in alignment with the weather.

### RMS Olympiad / Lockers

#### RMS Olympiad - Day 1 (come in sneakers!)

- On the first day of school, students will spend the day participating in a number activities that will help build community, set shared values, and orient themselves to our building.
- We will start the day with a Restorative Circle (Restorative Practices) to build community, create group norms, develop relationships and get to know each other.
- Students will then engage in a variety of activities throughout the course of the day such as:
  - Tour the building/scavenger hunt
  - Map out their schedule & develop time management calendar.
  - Meet the Encore Team of teachers and tour their rooms for MP 1.
  - Practice their locker combinations
  - o Grade level kickball/soccer game
  - o In class icebreakers/get to know RMS trivia game
  - Class meeting with Principal
  - Restorative circles check in/check out

#### **Hallway Lockers**

- Students will each be assigned hallway locker to store their belongings.
- All students will have the opportunity to practice their locker combination on the first day of school.
- Students will also develop a schedule for how to utilize their locker to maximize efficiency and plan out visits during the day (before/after PE, before/after lunch).

#### Drop-off

- Will occur in the lane closest to the school.
   Please leave the lane closest to the green open for busses.
- All students will enter through the front of the building via the doors outside of the Art Room.
- Upon arrival, students will report to their locker to start preparations for the day.
- Once they have their belongings for the morning, they may report to their period 1 class for the designated letter day and stay outside in the hallway until welcomed in by the teacher.

Will occur in the lane closest to the school. Please leave the lane closest to the green open for busses.

- Students who are taking the bus will report to the loop outside of the Board of Education building.
- Students who are being picked up by a parent will be released to the front of the building and will wait on the sidewalk near the building for pickup.

\*Busses will be using the loop outside of the BOE office, parents must stay out of this area to avoid traffic backup.\*

### Running Records, Report Cards, Standards

#### **Running Records**

We conduct running records for the purposes of establishing baseline assessment data, which is then used to create individual goals that drives our whole group and small group instructional practice. This happens for all students.

Progress is monitored through formative and summative measures including repeats of the benchmark assessment 3 times per year in both ELA and Mathematics.

Results of these assessments are provided to all stakeholders to ensure this partnership helps each student grow to their maximum potential.

#### Report Cards & Standards

- RMS uses both numerical grading as well as standards for each content area.
- You will also see GPB (global performance behaviors) that come from both homeroom teachers and Encore staff over the course of the school year. (We will denote which staff member is reflected in the current GPB for any given Trimester).
- Please know that standards reflect growth across the entire curriculum so it is possible to see (2's) during trimester 1 as students are still progressing through a standard or have not yet gained full exposure. This is considered on target for the first grading cycle.

# Reporting Attendance / Signing out students / Dropping off materials

- Option #1 You can login into the Genesis parent portal and report your child absent for the day. The Technology department will be sharting information about how to do this in the coming week(s).

- Please do not send emails to homeroom teachers or other staff members to report an absence.

#### Signing out your child from school

- If possible, please let the main office know of your child's scheduled early dismissal from school.
- Ring the buzzer, check in at the front table and fill out the sign out form.
- Report to the main office.

#### Dropping off items to the building

• In the event that your child has forgotten an item that needs to be dropped off at school, we have provided a secure bin located at the front of the building, by the main entrance. Please open the lid and place the item with the child's name on it into the bin. Please ring the bell and communicate your intent to drop off an item for your child. This bin is under video surveillance so it is safe to leave musical instruments and Chromebooks. There is no need to bring the object into the building.

### **Use of Cell Phones**

#### For Students

- Students are not permitted to use cell phones through the school day.
- They are to remain in student lockers.
- If a student's cell phone is turned into the main office, a parent or guardian will have to pick it up at the end of the day.
- If it occurs again, students will have to turn in their cell phone to the main office at the start of the school day.
- Students are not permitted to use their phones to take photos/videos of the building and/or other students/staff.
- Students who take and post pictures to a social media site will face disciplinary consequences.

#### For Parents

- In the event of an emergency, call the main office and we will work with you to communicate as necessary.
